**CENTRAL WAREHOUSING CORPORATION EMPLOYEES  
MEDICAL ATTENDANCE SCHEME, 1983.**

**PREAMBLE**

In accordance with Regulation 40 of the Central Warehousing Corporation (Staff) Regulations, employees and members of their families shall be provided with such medical facilities as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time.

With the approval of the Executive Committee and the concurrence of the Ministry of Health, the Corporation joined the Central Government Health Scheme in 1960 with a view to provide medical facilities to its employees posted in Delhi. Prior to this, the Corporation was availing of medical facilities under the Delhi Medical and Nursing Home Benefits Scheme. In so far as the employees posted in the field units and the areas not covered by the Central Government Health Scheme were concerned, they were governed by the Central Services Medical Attendance Rules, 1944.

2. There has been persistent demand from the employees of the Corporation for withdrawal from the Central Government Health Scheme and introduction of some liberalised scheme to provide them adequate medical facilities as the existing facilities were not only inadequate but also difficult to avail. The matter was considered at length from time to time and in their Meeting held on 25.3.1982, the Board of Directors constituted a sub-Committee to go into the entire question and submit a Report to the Board for taking necessary action. The recommendations of the Sub-Committee of Directors were considered in the Board Meeting held on 25th January, 1983 and after discussing the Report, the Board accorded approval with modifications and authorised the Managing Director to incorporate these modifications in the Report of the Sub-Committee and implement the Scheme with effect from 1.4.1983. Accordingly, after incorporating the desired modifications in the Scheme, the Final Report of the Sub-Committee duly signed by the members was submitted to the Board of Directors in their Meeting held on 10th February, 1983 for information. Based on the decision of the Board accepting the recommendations of the Sub-Committee, this Scheme of Medical Facilities for the employees of Central Warehousing Corporation to be known as Central Warehousing Corporation Employees Medical Attendance Scheme, 1983 herein after referred to as the Scheme came into force from 1st April, 1983.

1. **Short Title & Commencement:**

This Scheme will be called "Central Warehousing Corporation Employees' Medical Attendance Scheme, 1983" and shall come into force from the 1st day of April, 1983.

2. Extent of Application

This Scheme shall apply to all the whole time employees of the Corporation including those on deputation. The Employees on deputation will, however, have an option to elect to be governed by the medical facilities of their parent Department.

3. Definitions: In this Scheme, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context:-

- (i) "Authorised Medical Attendant": means the Corporation's Doctor(s) and the Doctors nominated as such by the Corporation in so far as Allopathic System of Medicines is concerned. In the case of other systems of Medicines viz. Homoeopathic, Unani, Ayurvedic, Siddha etc., however, only the Government Doctors will be treated as AMAs for the purpose of these rules.
- (ii) "Specialist": means any Registered Medical Practitioner with a Post-Graduate Degree in any specialised branch of medicine or surgery.
- (iii) "Family" means and includes the spouse and the wholly dependent parent, children and step children of the employee:

Note:

- a) Female employees will, however, have a choice to include their parents or parent-in-law for the purpose of availing the medical facility under this Scheme.
- b) Such parents/parents-in-law will be regarded wholly/ mainly dependent on the employee, who normally reside with him/her and whose total monthly income from all sources does not exceed the pay of the employee subject to maximum income of the parents being Rs. 350/- per month.
- c) Only the sons and unmarried daughters, who are not employed will be treated as wholly dependent on the employee for the purpose of reimbursement of medical expenses under this Scheme.
- d) Where husband or wife of the employee, as the case may be, are employed in the Central/State Govt./ Corporations/autonomous bodies, financed wholly or partly by the Central or the State Govt., and Private organisation, which provide Medical Services, would be entitled to choose either the facilities under CWC Employees Medical Attendance Scheme, 1983, or the Medical facilities provided by the Organisation in which the spouse is employed. In these cases, the employee and the spouse will be required to furnish to the Corporation, a joint declaration as to who will prefer their claims for reimbursement of medical expenses incurred on medical attendance and treatment in respect of the wife/husband and the children in Form No.3.

Employees of the Corporation are required to furnish the dependency certificate (in duplicate) in respect of the family members in the prescribed Form No. 4.

- (iv) "Hospital": includes a Nursing Home also.
- (v) "Controlling Officer":- In the case of employees working at Head Office, the Controlling Officer will be the same as defined in Supplementary Rules for the purpose of admitting their TA Bills. In the case of field staff, the Controlling Officer will be the respective Regional Manager in whose jurisdiction the employee is working;
- (vi) "Corporation": means the "Central Warehousing Corporation" and will include the Regional Offices/ Port Operations Units and the Construction Cells.
- (vii) "Managing Director" means the Managing Director of the Corporation.

4. An employee shall, in respect of any illness befalling him or any Member of his/her family, and subject to this Scheme, be eligible for reimbursement of:

- (a) fee paid by him/her to an Authorised Medical Attendant for consultation;
- (b) the cost of such medicines, vaccines, Sera or other therapeutic substance purchased by him/her from licenced chemists and certified by the Authorised Medical Attendant to be essential for recovery or for the prevention of serious deterioration in the condition of the employee or any member of his/her family who has befallen ill.

Explanation:

The cost of medicines, including injections etc., supplied by/purchased from the Attending Physician is not reimbursable except in cases of emergency and that, too, for the first day of the treatment only.

- (c) The fee paid for such pathological/radiological or other methods of examination for the purpose of diagnosis as certified to be essential by the AMA.
- (d) The fee paid for consultation to Specialist(s), where consultations with such specialists are certified to be essential by the AMA;
- (e) The charges paid for treatment <sup>in a Hospital.</sup>
- (f) Treatment for eye diseases, testing of eye sight and all kinds of dental treatment.  
(Cost of spectacles, artificial dentures and hearing-aids will not be reimburse-able).
- (g) Reimbursement of expenses incurred for medical treatment under Homeopathic, Unani, Ayurvedic/Siddha systems will also be allowed if the treatment is taken from Government Hospitals/Doctors.

5. Extent of consultation fee:

Maximum reimbursement of consultation fee under clause (a) (d) & (g) of paragraph-4 above applicable to Class A, B-I and B-II cities (as classified for purpose of HRA), Port towns and such other cities as may be notified by the Corporation will be as under:

(d) The rates of consultation fee for outdoor/indoor treatment at mofussil towns where the C.W.C. units are located will be fixed by the Corporation with the approval of the Managing Director, keeping all relevant factors in view.

(e) The Authorised Medical Attendants will be charging only consultation fee and/or fee for administering injections, but the medicines prescribed by the AMAs will have to be purchased by the employees from the licenced chemists.

Exception: - The cost of medicines supplied by AMAs in cases of extreme emergency during the first day of treatment can also be reimbursed.

6. MISCELLANEOUS ENTITLEMENTS:

(1) For the purpose of clause (b) of para-4, an employee shall not be eligible for reimbursement of the cost of such medicines, vaccine, sera or other therapeutic substances which are declared to be inadmissible for the purpose of reimbursement by the Central Govt. under the CSMA Rules, 1944.

(2) For the purpose of Clause (e) and (g) of para-4, treatment shall include (i) use of all medical and surgical

facilities available at the Hospital in which the employee is treated; (ii) the employment of such pathological, bacteriological, radiological or other methods of diagnosis, as are considered necessary by the Hospital Authorities; (iii) the supply of such medicines, vaccines, sera or other therapeutic substances as are certified by the Hospital authorities to be essential for the recovery or for the prevention of the serious deterioration in the condition of the patient; (iv) such accommodations as are ordinarily provided in the hospital and is suited to his/her status but subject to the financial limits mentioned in para 6 (3) below; (v) such Nursing as is ordinarily provided to in-patients by the Hospital; (vi) in the case of female employees or the wife of a male employee, treatment includes confinement, gynaecological, pre-natal as well as post-natal treatment at a Hospital.

**NOTE:**

I. Charges on account of treatment for immunising for prophylactic purposes will not be reimbursed except in cases of communicable diseases viz. Cholera, Typhoid, group of fevers, Plague, Diphtheria, Whooping cough and Tetanus.

II. The cost of vaccinations, inoculations, injections taken by an employee to secure Health Certificate under International Travel Regulations will be reimbursed provided the journey is undertaken at the expense of the Corporation.

(3) In cases where the employee or a member of his family undergoes treatment in any Hospital, the reimbursement of expenditure incurred may be restricted to the extent of charges levied by AIIMS for a similar treatment. The reimbursement of room charges may, however, be restricted to the extent given below:-

Note: Rates are exclusive of diet charges which will be borne by the employees.

**7. MISCELLANEOUS**

**(1) Submission of Claims:**

Claims for reimbursement will be preferred in Form No.1. The claim should accompany the required Essentiality Certificate

in Form No.2 duly countersigned (by) the AMA/Hospital Authorities and supported by original prescriptions, cash memos, receipts for fees paid to Specialists and charges for Surgical Operations, maternity and Hospital accommodations, pathological bacteriological and radiological examinations and treatments.

(2) TIME LIMIT FOR SUBMISSION OF MEDICAL CLAIMS

Final claims for reimbursement of medical expenses of the employees in respect of a particular spell of illness should be preferred within 3 months from the date of completion of treatment as shown in the last essentiality certificate issued by the AMA/M.O. I/c of the Hospital otherwise the same will be rejected.

(3) GRANT OF ADVANCES:

The Managing Director may grant advances to the employees to enable them initially to meet expenditure on medical attendance and treatment for themselves and the members of their families on the terms and conditions laid down in the CSMA Rules, 1944.

(4) MEDICAL CERTIFICATE:

Medical/Fitness certificate issued by the AMAs/Hospital Authorities on the prescribed Form No.5 & 6 will be recognised for the purpose of commutation of leave on medical grounds irrespective of the status of the employees.

(5) GENERAL

All matters for which a specific provision has not been made in this Scheme shall be regulated in accordance with the provisions of CS(MA) Rules, 1944 and orders issued thereunder from time to time. In cases of doubt or dispute, the orders of the Managing Director will be final and binding.

SUB: CENTRAL WAREHOUSING CORPORATION EMPLOYEES MEDICAL  
ATTENDANCE SCHEME 1983 - AMENDMENT THEREOF

On the basis of provisions in Staff Regulations, the employees and members of their families are being provided with such medical facilities as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time. On the basis of BOD's approval, the Central Warehousing Corporation Employees Medical Attendance Scheme was introduced w.e.f. 1.4.1983. During the period of its operation, a number of difficulties were faced by the employees due to which it became necessary to review the existing provisions and make amendments whenever necessary. Further more, as per the Second Wage Revision in respect of Group C&D Employees, the reimbursement of outdoor treatment expenses on a self certificate is to be made upto Rs.300/- per quarter.

Based on the review of the existing scheme and the agreement reached in respect of Group C&D employees, the following modifications/additions have been made in the scheme with the approval of Board of Directors in its meeting held on 30.12.1992.

1. Group C&D employees will be reimbursed with the outdoor treatment expenses upto the extent of Rs.300/- per quarter on self certificate in the prescribed format enclosed herewith. The other category of employees will be allowed to take treatment from any registered medical practitioner. The practice of empanelment of M.D. by the Corporation has been dispensed with.
2. The indoor treatment to the employees and their dependant family members will be allowed only in designated Hospitals/Nursing Homes. The Govt./Govt. recognised Hospitals/Hospitals run by Public Sector Undertakings/Local authorities/trusts and certain reputed Nursing Homes will be designated for the purpose of reimbursement of medical expenses. For specialised treatment like heart, some reputed Hospitals will also be designated for the treatment of employees.

The treatment expenses in such Hospitals will be reimbursed in full except room rent. As far as possible, the indoor treatment expenses will be paid directly to the Hospitals instead of reimbursing to the individual employees depending upon the willingness of the Hospitals. The room rent in such cases will be restricted to the admissible rates of the Corporation which are given below:-

3. The Regional Managers/warehouse Managers and other field units are requested to collect the information about the location of Govt./Govt. recognised Hospitals/Hospitals run by Public Sector Undertakings/Local authorities/Trust in their area together with detailed rates for various items of treatment and submit to this office for the needful. In addition to this, certain reputed Nursing Homes may also be located and intimated together with rates of various items. While furnishing the list of all such Hospitals/Nursing Homes, the detailed recommendations basing on the need of the employees may also be sent.
4. Till the process of designating the Hospitals/Nursing Homes is finalised, the present system of indoor treatment in Hospital/Nursing Homes will continue according to which the treatment expenses are reimbursed on the basis of rate schedule of IIMS.

5. Generally, no indoor treatment will be allowed in the Hospitals/Nursing Homes, which are not designated by the Corporation, as per the list of designated Hospitals/Nursing Homes as finalised by the Corporation. However, in extreme emergency, the reimbursement of treatment expenses taken from non-designated Hospitals/Nursing Homes can be considered on the merits of the case restricting to a maximum of 2 days treatment keeping in view the nature of ailment and condition of the patient.
6. The pathological test performed in any Hospital/Lab on the advice of medical practitioner will be considered for reimbursement on the basis of rate schedule of AIMS. Wherever, no rates are available in the rate schedule of AIMS; the reimbursement will be restricted to the rates of nearest Govt. or Govt. recognised Hospitals.
7. The initial period of treatment will now be considered as 15 days instead of 10 days. Also in addition to the list of chronic diseases in CSM. Rules, the diseases like Heart, Skin and Gasterities will be added for prolonged treatment. As such the list of chronic diseases will include cancer, Diabities Mental Diseases, Poliomyeliti-s, Tuberculosis, Leprosy, Heart ailment, Skin Diseases, Gasterities. The prolonged treatment for such chronic diseases will be allowed in accordance with the provisions of CSM. Rules and in Govt./Govt. recognised Hospitals whether outdoor or indoor.
8. MAXIMUM CONSULTATION FEE IN RESPECT OF ENTITLED CATEGORY OF EMPLOYEES.

(b) Maximum Consultation Fee for Specialist

- i) The first consultation and subsequent consultation in A&B class cities will be allowed upto Rs.50/- and Rs.30/- respectively.
- ii) The first consultation and subsequent consultation in C & other unclassified cities will be allowed upto Rs.35/- and Rs.20/- respectively.

c) Maximum Consultation fee for domiciliary visits

- i) For domiciliary consultation, an additional amount of Rs.15/- in A&B class cities and Rs.10/- in other cities will be allowed in addition to the normal consultation fee admissible.
- ii) For domiciliary consultation with Specialist, an additional amount of Rs.25/- in A&B class cities and Rs.15/- in other cities will be admissible in addition to the normal Specialist consultation fee.

d) The total number of consultations at the residence and with the Specialist (irrespective of whether at the clinic or Nursing Home or at the residence) shall not exceed 3.

e) Consultation with homoeopathic medical practitioner

It has been observed that the Doctors do not generally prescribe medicines but supply the same to the patients themselves and charge a consolidated amount towards consultation fee as well as cost of medicines. It has, therefore, been decided that the reimbursement in the case of homoeopathic treatment will be allowed upto Rs.10/- for 3 days treatment, Rs.25/- for treatment of one week and Rs.50/- upto the treatment of a fortnight. The treatment will have to be taken only from qualified doctors (Registration No. would invariably be indicated in the claims). In case homoeopathic Doctor prescribe medicines and these are purchased against the cash memo the cost thereof will be reimbursed in full.

In case of Ayurvedic/Homoeopathic treatment, the consultation fee will be allowed upto Rs.15/- for first consultation and Rs.10/- for subsequent consultation in A & B class cities and upto Rs.10/- and Rs.8/- respectively in other class of cities. If any homoeopathic Doctor is prescribing the medicine and is not charging anything towards the cost of medicine, the consultation fee admissible to Ayurvedic Doctors will be payable to him.

- g) In certain cases where patients are not admitted for indoor treatment but advised/administered dextrose/Glucose solution in Clinic itself in respect of certain diseases like dehydration, the charges for administering the Glucose/Dextrose solution will be allowed upto Rs.25/- per bottle.
- h) For antiseptic dressings, the medical practitioner will be allowed upto Rs.10/- in A & B class cities and upto Rs.5/- in other cities for such dressing including the dressing material.

8. The treatment expenses, becoming necessary on account of occupational hazards due to nature of duties of the employee, will be reimbursed in full for indoor as well as outdoor treatment.

The above modifications/additions will be applicable with immediate effect. Other provisions of CWC Employees Medical Attendance Scheme, 1983 will remain unchanged and wherever any dispute arises the same will be governed by CSM Rules.

The Regional Managers/Warehouse Managers are, therefore, advised to send the list of Hospitals/Nursing Homes together with their rate list for designating them for the treatment of employees and other family members. The Warehouse Managers may submit their proposals to the concerned Regional Managers so as to enable them to prepare consolidated proposal for onward transmission to this office.

C I R C U L A R

Central Warehousing Corporation Medical Attendance Scheme was introduced during the year 1983 with a view to provide medical benefits to the employees and members of their families. The scheme was reviewed during the year 1992 and certain improvements were made in the existing scheme and which was communicated vide office letter dated 27.1.93. There has been alround increase in the cost of medical facilities provided by the hospitals, nursing homes and they are charging higher fee and the charges for the treatment given to the patients.

The scheme was therefore, reviewed and the matter was placed before the BOD in its meeting held on 24.9.98. The Board has approved the following improvements in the Central Warehousing Corporation Employees Medical Attendance Scheme.

In homeopathic treatment, the doctors do not prescribe medicines but also supply the same to the patients by themselves often and charge consolidated amount towards consultation fee as well as cost of medicines. It has therefore, been decided that the reimbursement in case of homeopathic treatment may be allowed upto Rs.60/- for 3 days treatment and Rs.100/- for one week treatment and upto Rs.150/- for fortnight treatment. The treatment should be taken from a qualified doctor and the registration number of Homeopathic doctor should invariably be indicated. Where the Homeopathic doctor prescribe medicines which are purchased against cash memos, the same shall also be reimbursed in full.

At present, the charges incurred for radiological/pathological/operation etc. are being reimbursed on the basis of rate schedule of AIIMS. It has now been decided to reimburse the charges for radiological/pathological, surgery etc. at the rates prescribed by CGHS/instead of AIIMS. CGHS rate list is already forwarded vide this office letter no.CWC/MS-6/Admn. dated 5.10.97.

6. MISCELLANEOUS

The existing practice of obtaining Ess. Liability certificate from the medical attendance (C) certificate should not be dispensed with and the employee is required to furnish the information in the prescription itself in the following manner:


- a. Name of the disease
- b. Period of treatment
- c. Receipt in token of payment of consultation and injection fee etc.
- d. Mention about advising for Radiological/Pathological/ investigations.

However, the medical claim in the prescribed format would continue to be submitted by the employees.

In case of hospitalisation also, the certificate need not be insisted and the supporting documents like prescription, receipts etc. issued by the hospital together with details will suffice.

The revised scheme in case of C & L employees will be applicable for indoor treatment only, since for outdoor treatment except for chronic diseases they are covered under MOU signed between the Management and the union representatives from time to time.

The above instructions will come into force from the date of issue of the Circular. However, the cases already settled will not be re-opened. The other provisions of CWC Medical Attendance Scheme 1983 will remain unchanged and whenever any dispute arises, the same will be governed by CSMA rules.

The entitlement for accommodation of the employees for self and their dependent family members shall be as under:-

In all the cases requiring indoor treatment as referred to by the attending Doctor for which the authorisation letter will be issued by Personnel Manager/Dy. Manager (Admn.)/Asstt. Manager (Admn.) of Corp. Office, New Delhi. The employees serving outside the jurisdiction of Corporate Office shall also obtain authorisation letter from Corp. Office on the basis of recommendations of RM/SE/EE as the case may be. However, RM/SE/EE will scrutinise the request of employee along with the recommendations of local hospital/Doctor recommending for, indoor treatment in Delhi based hospital and forward the requisite documents in original to Corporate Office.

In case of very emergent indoor treatment the employees may approach hospital authorities directly on the strength of Identity Card for which the authorisation can be issued on the next working day on the basis of certificate issued by concerned hospital authority to the effect that the employee or his/her family member was admitted/given the indoor treatment in case of emergency. Further, in case of dependent family members, the employee concerned shall give an undertaking in the format enclosed to be retained along with the identity card by the hospital authority till the issue of proper authorisation letter.

The hospital would provide medicines and all other necessary items/facilities which are generally required for the best treatment to the patient except inadmissible items like cosmetics etc. from their store since as per policy, officials are not required to purchase medicines from outside when admitted in empanelled hospital.

Since a number of hospitals have been empanelled by the Corpn. for indoor treatment of the employees on Direct payment system in Delhi, hence for the employees posted in Delhi, area under CO/RO/CC shall not be sanctioned any medical advance except in exceptional cases such as treatment taken from Govt./Govt. recognised hospital.

The claims forwarded by these hospitals shall be settled by Dy. Manager (salary), CWC, Corporate Office, New Delhi for employees of the Corporate Office. Further the claim of employees serving outside the jurisdiction of Corporate Office the same will be settled by Accounts Section of the concerned RO/CC.

In so far as hospitals at S.No. 5,6,& 7 the Referral letters would be issued only after carefully examining the merit of the case and the employees shall have no right in this regard.

It is requested that the contents of this circular should be brought to the notice of all the officers/staff so as to enable them to avail the facility if need arises.

Attention is invited to office circular of even no. dated 21.11.94 wherein it was conveyed that pending empanelment of hospitals all Govt. hospitals and hospitals recognised by Govt. of India for Central Govt. employees will henceforth be treated as designated hospitals for the purpose of reimbursement of medical expenses incurred for indoor treatment in full by restricting room rent to the admissibility of the individual. The room rent has since been revised vide office circular dt. 6.10.98.

We have been receiving representations from employees that the reimbursement has not been effected in full as contemplated in the aforesaid circular and often they have to represent to Corporate office for getting the full reimbursement even after availing treatment from the Govt./Govt. recognised hospitals. The matter has been considered and it has been decided that full reimbursement to employees and their dependant family members be allowed restricting to the admissible room rent provided the treatment is undertaken in the Govt. hospital as aforesaid. Competent authority has therefore, desired that the instructions should be reiterated among the Regional Managers so as to avoid any further resentment from the employees. It is, therefore, requested to admit the bills of the employees for reimbursement of medical claim for Govt. hospitals in full restricting to admissible room rent. The list of Govt. recognised hospitals in each state is already available in the CSMA rules.





The concerned officer Incharge may ask the concerned employee to give reasonable proof about the member of family dependent on him/her, such as Ration Card, Pension certificate of parents etc. In order to satisfy themselves about the genuineness of dependency certificate where the spouse or any other members of the family of the employee is employed, a certificate with regard to non-availability of any medical allowance/reimbursement of medical expenditure by the employer should also be attached. The concerned officer Incharge shall satisfy him/herself about the declaration made by the employees and record a certificate to this effect on declaration form. The dependency certificate will be submitted to the Competent Authority i.e. RM, SE, EE, and Divisional Heads at CO. The declaration certificate should be submitted in the proforma (triplicate). The same is enclosed herewith.

The treatment given by the said part time Physician appointed by the CWC may be treated as OPD treatment given in recognized hospital/nursing home for the purpose of counting the period.
6. At present as per the existing CSMA rule, which is followed as per the Medical Scheme, Consulting Doctor, can supply medicines by himself on the first day of the treatment. Sometimes Doctor may supply medicines by himself in urgency for more than 1 day also. The existing restriction on supply for one-day medicine may be causing hardship to the employees therefore, to obviate this it is recommended that the supply of medicines by Doctor himself shall be enhanced to maximum 7 days instead of existing one day.

There is no change in room rent for indoor treatment.

Radiological/Pathological/procedure for surgery etc. and medicine supplied by the Homeopathic/Ayurvedic/Unani Medicine Practitioners will be followed as per CO Circular dated 06.10.1998.

The above instructions will come into force from the date of issue of this circular. However, the cases already settled will not be re-opened. The other provisions of CWC Medical Attendance Scheme 1983 will remain unchanged and whenever any dispute arises, the same will be governed by CSMA rules as per CO Circular No.CWC/Medical/Misc/Admn, dated 25<sup>th</sup> May, 1999, it is again reiterated that in case of Group C & D employees the condition regarding reimbursement of outdoor treatment for prolonged and declared chronic diseases shall be allowed provided the 1st diagnosis/consultation is obtained from Govt./Govt. Recognized or Corporations designated hospitals.

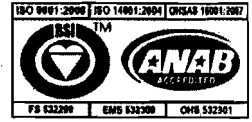



The room rent charges has been revised by the CGHS vide order dated 16.11.2010 and the Competent Authority has approved the same as per admissibility of the officers/employees as under:-

"In case the eligible accommodation is not available at the time of admission the patient will be admitted to lower category of accommodation. But if patient is provided higher category accommodation at his/her own request, the differential amount will be borne by the beneficiary and the difference amount will be collected by the hospital at the time of his/her discharge. If the higher category accommodation is provided by the hospital in the event of non-availability of entitled accommodation, the differential amount will be borne by the hospital concerned."

The hospitals are listed categories wise in CGHS as NON-NABH, NABL, NABH, Super Speciality. The rates charged by these hospitals shall be reimbursed accordingly after obtaining the certificate from empanelled hospitals as to whether they are actually listed in CGHS as categories wise, The same may also be seen at CGHS website.

The indoor treatment for the employees and their dependent may be taken for illness of specialized diseases, which cannot be treated at OPD. The authorization letter shall be issued for indoor treatment on the recommendation of the concerned Doctor of the hospital and not for the investigation, diagnostic procedures etc.
